On behalf of the Gulberwick, Quarff and Cunningsburgh Community Council, I am very happy to write in support of the Shetland Community Screening Project being developed through Viking Genes at the University of Edinburgh.

Our Community Council is well aware of the work Viking Genes has already carried out in Shetland and the clear evidence it has provided about the higher prevalence of certain inherited health risks within our population. The proposal to offer a community-wide screening programme feels both timely and important, and we see it as a positive, practical step towards earlier intervention, better health outcomes, and peace of mind for many individuals and families.

We particularly welcome the project's focus on prevention and informed choice, supported by established NHS care pathways. The potential to identify people at risk before illness develops, and to support them to take appropriate action, is something we believe would make a real difference within our communities. We also recognise the wider value of this work in contributing to research, education, and the future direction of public health policy in Scotland.

The level of local engagement and fundraising support already shown for the project speaks volumes about how strongly it resonates with people across Shetland. We feel this reflects a genuine appetite for giving people the option to understand and manage their health risks, while fully respecting individual choice.
